Wheat—A liberal supply of bearish news during the early part of the session induced fair short sales on the part of local traders, but later in the day reports of export business and disappointing domestic receipts regarding the situation in the wheat producing countries, caused early sellers to seek shelter and advanced prices about 1c from the point, and closed the market firm around the top.

Corn and oats received good support from influential interests and maintained a strong tone during the entire session. The close was firm, with the best prices of the day in evidence.

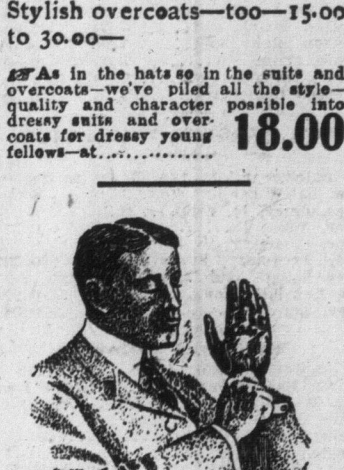
