Justice Robertson Grants a Winding Up Order With E. R. C. Clarkson as Liquidator.

Mr. Justice Robertson has given judgment on the application of creditors of the John Eaton Company of Toronto, Limited, for orders for the winding up of the company under R. S. C., ch. 129.

A Reply to Mr. Clarkson. Editor: World: In addressing this letter to you we do not wish to be taken as assuming a position, nor do we want to be drawn into a newspaper correspondence, but as Mr. Clarkson's agents have issued to the creditors a circular which we deem it our duty to call attention to some errors which have crept into it.

Now, with reference to the article which appeared in the newspapers, which Mr. Clarkson says was approved by the committee, we were never brought formally before the committee. Some of the committee say it was never mentioned at all.

Mr. Clarkson, in his letter, further says: "We were not and never have been the auditors of the John Eaton Company, and never received any remuneration from them for professional services."

However, as a winding-up order has been granted upon the application of Mr. Clarkson as liquidator, we will defer further discussion until the meeting which will be held to decide upon a permanent liquidator to the company's affairs.
