TURN IN WHEAT FUTURES.

Chicago Options Fell a Cent and Then Recovered.

Course of the Markets on the Other Side of the Water-Corn Lower and Then Higher - Local Grain, Produce and Live Stock Quotations-Notes and Gossip.

Liverpool wheat futures were very heavy to-day, closing 3/4 to 1/2 per cent below yesterday's final figures.

Paris wheat to-day closed 5 to 15 cents higher than yesterday's, with four unchanged to 5 centimes lower.

Chicago wheat futures opened weak this morning and declined to a point, nearly a cent below yesterday's final figures.

Liverpool maize futures to-day declined a net 1/4 to 1/2 per cent from yesterday's closing, but recovered and closed 1/2 per bushel higher than yesterday.

Flour declined 6d at Liverpool to-day. Liverpool wheat receipts the past three days \$8,000 cents, including 45,000 cents of American.

Wheat receipts at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day 612 cars, against 303 the corresponding day of 1898.

THE CATTLE MARKETS. British Markets Little Changed, But the Feeding is Weaker.

Montreal, March 14.—(Special to The World.)—The British markets for the week were very little changed from the heavy decline experienced last Monday, but the feeling is decidedly weaker.

Canadian and American steers were unchanged from last week's quotations, but Argentine steers, both cattle and sheep, made a heavy slump of 14c and 15c per pound respectively.

Best steers, 11 1/2c to 12c; best Canadian, 11c to 12c; Argentine, 10 1/2c to 11c; for clipped, 11 1/2c with the wool on.

Canadian lambs, 15c per pound. All quotations sinking the offal.

Live Stock in New York. New York, March 14.—(Receives-Receipts, \$200,000.)—Receipts of live stock, cattle, weak. Exports, 800 cattle and 4800 quarts of beef.

Sheep—Receipts, 98 head; 385 on sale; market shade lower; all sold. Veals, \$5 to \$7.50; no fed calves.

Chicago Cattle Market. Chicago, March 14.—There was a fairly active demand for cattle to-day and prices were steady, with a few exceptions.
