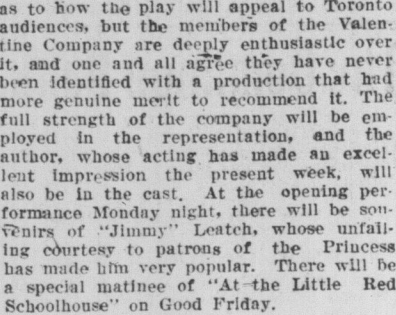

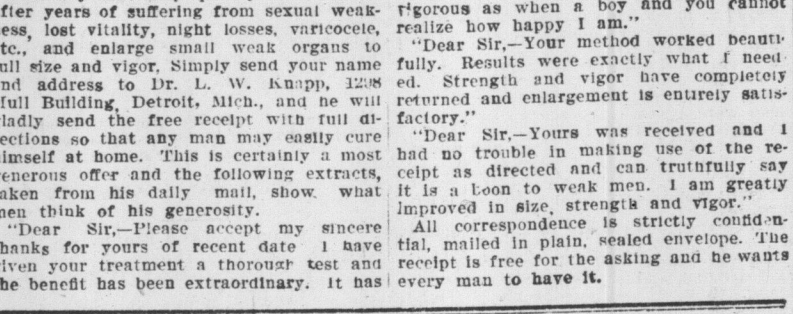

North Toronto Finances Show a Good Surplus of Assets Over Liabilities.
