That will constitute a legitimate grievance for the opposition. It will destroy the chief value of a verdict of acquittal. If the judges accept instructions which limit the scope of the inquiry, or permit less freedom of investigation than the Committee on Privileges and Elections affords, Conservatives will feel that the bench has intervened to protect a party government, and that respect for judiciary which is so vital to the sound administration of justice will be impaired.
