Nov. 21, 1873.—The Report of the "Quebec Scheme" sub-committee was presented, with their recommendation of grants and conditions. The Report was adopted, and it was agreed that the grants should be made at the next meeting.

The "Quebec Scheme" committee recommended the following additional rule:—

"The receipt of the Clergymen for money given at the offertory may be received from the Church Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by D. C. S. from the people."

An application from Rev. Theophilus Richey for a grant towards meeting the deficiency in his salary, during the time that no grant from any external source was received at Kentville, was deferred to the next meeting.

An application for grant, under special circumstances, toward an outfit for Rev. F. Hiltz, was considered. It was finally agreed to grant the sum of \$80.

Several applications toward building churches having been presented, it was agreed:—

"That since it is necessary at present to devote all the efforts of the Society to support the living voice of the Church, it is not desirable to make grants toward building or enlarging churches."

DEC. 19, 1873.—The recommendation of the "Quebec Scheme" as to conditions and salaries were adopted in the following scale:—
