UNVEIL MONUMENT TO WAR'S VICTIMS The Japanese Unveil Structure Erected to Mark Graves of the Russian Dead.

Advice were received from the Orient by the Empress of India that the ceremony of unveiling the monument to the Russian dead took place on the 10th inst., at Port Arthur. When the monument was unveiled it was seen that one face bore the inscription in Russian already translated in these columns; another face carried the words "Erected by the Japanese Government"; on the third face was carved the inscription in Japanese "Monument to the memory of the Russian officers and soldiers who fell at Port Arthur," and on the rear face there was a long inscription in Japanese and composed by General Viscount Oshima.
