LOCAL NEWS

Hon. F. B. Carvell addressed a big meeting at Debec on Friday night and was well received.

ARREST 244 IN RAIDS
IN MONTREAL'S RED
LIGHT DISTRICT

Montreal's "red light" district, that portion of the city reaching from St. Ursule street to St. Denis street and extending from Craig street to La Gauchetière street, came within the police drag net during last Wednesday night and Thursday morning. The net captured 244 men and women taken from houses in that quarter.

From 7.30 p. m. until 3.30 a. m. the patrol wagon plied its way from house to house and back again over the same route, each load being the capture of a different house. The police, under Inspector Belanger and Captain Savard, with a squad of men, removed from fourteen houses eighty-five women and forty-four men taken during the raid. The net captured 244 men and women taken from houses in that quarter.

One housekeeper, where five inmates were taken, pleaded guilty to keeping a disorderly house, to selling liquor without a license and to having liquor on the premises. She was sentenced to pay fines amounting to \$250. The inmates were fined \$10 each and five minutes later the housekeeper produced a full roll of bills, paid her own heavy fine and that of seven inmates.

Several of the houses netted only women prisoners. Of the fourteen houses raided only two were not proved to be disorderly places and the alleged keepers of these two pleaded not guilty and charges of conducting such resorts. For the others places of guilty were entered and fines ranging from \$50 to \$250 imposed by Recorder Geoffroy. In cases where the men found in the houses were called in by solicitors the recorder fined the prisoner lightly, but the keepers were severely dealt with.

The "red light" in Montreal continues to pay for its rays. On Friday morning 117 more men and women caught in raids made, appeared before Recorder Geoffroy, and were fined in all \$2,774.48. This is a record for the city, although on Thursday over \$2,000 were collected in fines for similar offences. Two alleged keepers pleaded not guilty. One house paid in fines \$204.

The clean up once more taxed the women.

EX-CAZAR'S DAUGHTER
MAKES HER ESCAPE;
ON WAY TO THE U. S.

New York, Nov. 25.—Miss Tatiana Nicolaevna Romanoff, daughter of the late Emperor Nicholas II, who fled from Russia, has escaped Siberia through a fictitious marriage to a son of a former chamberlain of the Czar and is now on her way to the United States, accompanied by an English woman, according to information made public here tonight by persons connected with the Russian civil relief.

The former grand duchess, who is twenty years old, made her escape from Tobolsk, the present home of the exiled emperor, to Harbin in Manchuria, and thence to Japan, where passage was taken on a steamship for either San Francisco or Vancouver.

The New York officers of the Russian civil relief, including Daniel Frohman, Ivan Narodny and Dr. Thomas Darlington, have been informed the young woman will arrive in New York early in December to play a prominent part in the work of the recently formed organization.

LIGHTS SUBDUED
NOW IN HALIFAX

Halifax, N. S., Nov. 25.—Military headquarters has issued an official announcement that, commencing Monday night, the restrictions of lights order in the Halifax district will be rigidly enforced. Military police are to co-operate with the civil force in the carrying out of the order in its strictest sense. Patrols will cover the city and also Dartmouth and visitors are to be prosecuted immediately. Hereafter all blinds in stores, factories, churches, halls, residences and all other buildings must be drawn all the way down and must be sufficient shade to prevent rays of light showing out of the side of the windows or underneath. Automobiles must effectively shade the upper half of their headlights. All street lights facing seaward are to be darkened on the seaward side while the remaining portion of the lamp is to be frosted. On Barrington street there are to be arrangements made for a number of small lights but the "white way" is to be kept completely obliterated.

London, Nov. 24.—Lord Rothermere, chief proprietor of the Daily Record and Mail, of Glasgow, and the Leeds Mercury, has accepted the post of air minister in the British cabinet, according to the Pall Mall Gazette.

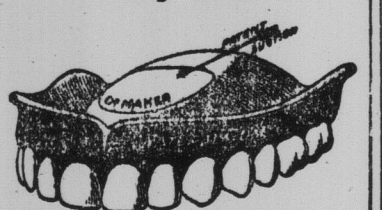
