

She was considered as handsome an animal as ever graced the trotting turf, and only two others of her gait, viz., Uhlan (1.58) and Lee Axworthy (1.584/4) have records faster, and only a mere shade at that.

The daughter of Sidney Dillon was foaled in 1898, bred by the Santa Rosa Stock Farm, Santa Rosa, Cal., and sold by that famous breeding farm in their consignment of horses that went under the hammer at one of the Fasig sales held in the early part of 1900 at the old Glenville mile track, Cleveland, Ohio.

Lou Dillon was purchased by C. K. Billings (still being his property) that famous sportsman paying the enormous sum of \$20,000 for the mare, she being practically green at the time, but the speed she had shown since arriving at Glenville course had warranted her purchaser that he had secured a diamond in the rough.


