GERMAN ANSWERS GERMAN (Toronto Mail and Empire.) Count von Moltke, the superseded chief of the German general staff, says that Germany's enemies are doing their best to prove that Germany provoked war at a moment it chose. "That is folly," he exclaimed, "for, by Germany's own admission, it was Germany that started this war against 'such superior numerical force is no child's play.' Then Count von Moltke goes on to ask, 'Why, if we were so eager for war, did we not strike one blow during the Russo-Japanese War, or when Great Britain was sorely tasked with the Boer War?' The question is easily answered. On pages 30 and 31 of his 'Imperial Germany,' Prince von Buelow, who was for fourteen years chancellor of the empire, and the chief guide of her destinies during the great building and preparatory period, says: 'But even if, by taking action in Europe, we had succeeded in thwarting England's South African policy, our immediate national interests would not have benefited thereby. From that moment onward for many a long day our relations with England would have been poisoned. England's passive resistance to the international policy of New Ger-

many would have been changed to very active hostility. During those years we were occupied in founding our navy, and even in the event of defeat in the South African War, it was possible for England to stifle our sea-power in the Boer War had its origin in weighty considerations of the national interests of the German Empire. Our navy was not strong enough for us forcibly to achieve a sufficient sea-power in the teeth of English resistance.' Ex-Chancellor Buelow also answers von Moltke completely on the question of neutrality during the Russo-Japanese War. On page 96 of the same book he says: 'Our attitude toward Russia during the Russo-Japanese War was modeled on our relations with England during the Boer War.' That is, peace, while Germany built for 'The Day.' Against Count von Moltke's denial that Germany wanted or provoked the war let us put the declaration of Maximal Harden, the keenest of German political writers, the editor of Die Zukunft, which was suppressed. 'Let us drop,' says he, 'our miserable attempts to excuse Germany's action. Not against our will and as a nation taken by surprise, did we hurl ourselves into this gigantic venture. We willed it. We had to will it. We do not stand before the judgment seat of Europe. We acknowledge no such jurisdiction. Our might shall create a new law in Europe. It is Germany that strikes. When she has conquered new domains for herself, then the priesthods of all the gods will praise the God of War.'

HIGH PRICE FOR SHIPS. As an instance of the increased value of ships on account of the war, the recent sale of the steel sailing vessel Brynhilda is quoted. Twenty-six years ago the Brynhilda was built for J. W. Carmichael & Co., of New Glasgow, at a cost of \$75,000. After sailing her for a number of years they sold her about ten years ago, when shipping had declined and the value of sailing ships particularly lessened, for \$25,000, and at that figure the sale was rated a good one. Last week this twenty-six-year-old vessel was sold for \$78,000, within \$2,000 of her original cost.
