

With our ten celectric power and a tenment blower we can fill the smaller silo in a day. I can, with the help of a milking machine, operated in the same way, milk twenty-two cows in an hour. Without this power I would need to have a man and boy to help with the milking. In the house Mrs. Griesbach finds, with the aid of the electrical conveniences provided, she can do her own housework with less strain than she would sustain in doing it with the aid of domestic help, but without the conveniences which electrical energy makes possible."
