LACROSSE.

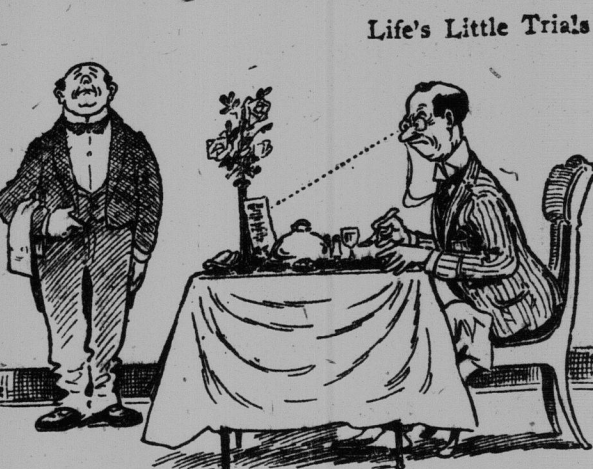
Vancouver Won.
