JAMES M'NAIR, Who died at Dillon's Bay, 16th July, SURGEON DENTIST, 1870, and JAMES D. GORDON, Killed at Portinia Bay, March 7th,

It is a faithful saving and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." -1 TIM. i. 15. This inscription was sent to the

It is to be printed on a tablet of wood to be placed in the church at Dilon's Bay, so that all the natives, who are taught, may be able to meet there from time to inscriptions in English, but the rapid growth of tropical plants soon hide- August 22, 1876. the stones, and the natives cannot read the inscription. 




