MONTREAL, Sept. 13. — The Cana-dian Pacific Railway Company's R. M. S. Empress of Britain, which left Liv-erpoiol just 24 hours before the Lusi-tania, landed passengers and malls at Rimouski yesterday afternoon at 2 o'clock, exactly 20 hours before the malls of the Lusitania were landed at New York. Had the Empress sailed from Moville, the mail port, at the north of Ireland,, relatively the same as Queenstown is at the south of Ire-land, the time from that place to Ri-mouski would have been 5 days 5 hours and 10 minutes. 
