

CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even-numbered section of Dom-inion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan

and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not re-served, may be homesteaded by any per-son who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the derly plans in the kitchen. extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less. Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the dis-trict in which the land is situate. Entry


by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. DUTIES.---(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the

land in each year for three years. (2) A homesteader may, if he so de-

es, perform the required residence ties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain condi-


