MOB WRECKS ANOTHER HOTEL IN CALGARY

Calgary, Feb. 11.—Another riotous outbreak on the part of the soldiers belonging to the garrison here occurred tonight, and for two hours the authorities, police and militia were powerless to cope with the mob.

Riverside Hotel, a two-story brick and frame structure in the Riverside district, north of the Bow river, was attacked by a crowd of about 500 soldiers and civilians and thoroughly wrecked. The windows were smashed, frames and all, and most of the furniture pitched out into the snow, where it was broken to bits by the shouting crowd.

EXPLANATION SATISFIED THEM

Edmonton, Alta., Feb. 11.—Threats of some of the troops in barracks here to attack the McDonald Hotel and the Edmonton Bulletin tonight resulted in pickets being placed on guard over these buildings by Lieut.-Col. McKinney and Lieut.-Col. McLeod, of the 68th and 63rd Battalions.

The objection taken to the McDonald Hotel was that alien labor was being employed there, and the misconception of an editorial reference in the Bulletin was the cause of the ill feeling towards that paper.

SUBMARINE CREW OF 17 IN SUICIDE PACT

Montreal Army Surgeon Tells of Gruesome Sighting Aboard German Undersea Boat Captured by British.

(Boston Globe.) New York, Feb. 10.—Rather than be captured alive by the British, the crew of a German submarine, trapped in the English Channel off the Isle of Wight, apparently carried out a suicide pact. The craft was towed into port and the 17 men aboard her were found shot through the head.

Dr. M. S. Inglish of Montreal, a Canadian army surgeon, who arrived here today on the Anchor liner Cameronia, from Liverpool, on leave after service in France, told of the occurrence. He said he was at the place when four German submarines were brought in. With a British naval officer he went down into one in which the crew were shot; the perspective of the craft had been broken off by a chain drag of British patrol boats.

Apparently it was not a case of fearing death, even from suffocation, as when the hatch of the craft was pried off and those who examined her went down the spiral ladder to view the ghastly sight that confronted them, it was found that the men could have kept alive.

VISITORS MUST BE VOUCHERED FOR

Before Admitted to Royal Victoria Museum Where Parliament Is Making Temporary Home.

Ottawa, Feb. 11, via leased wire.—Notices were posted tonight that no one will be admitted to the Royal Victoria Museum, now used as a parliament building, unless vouched for personally by a senator, member or an officer of the house. Persons admitted in this manner must, on each occasion on entering the building, give his name to the officer at the door, and a daily record will be kept for the commissioner of dominion police. The police have very strict orders to enforce the rule, without exception. Seasonal cards previously issued for the galleries have been cancelled.


