

NEW BRUNSWICK MEN IN CASUALTY LIST

Private "Bud" Tippet of Fairville From Firing Line to Cardiff Hospital, Seriously Ill—Sergeant-Major Adams of Hampton Among the Wounded—Two Moncton Men Wounded—Appalling List of Casualties Among Western Battalions—Canadian Casualties May Total 8,000, it is Feared.

The news that another local man is on the casualty list was received yesterday in a cablegram announcing that "Bud" Tippet, of Fairville was seriously ill in a hospital in Great Britain.

George H. Tippet, of Fairville, his father, received the cablegram on Sunday morning. The message was as follows:

Ottawa, May 2, 1915.

George H. Tippet, Fairville.

Sincerely regret to inform you that number 22,798, Private S. B. Tippet, 14th Battalion, officially reported seriously ill at Western General Hospital, Cardiff. Further particulars, when received, will be sent.

(Sgd.) ADJUTANT GENERAL.

As the meagreness of the information contained in the cable added to the anxiety of the family, Mr. Tippet immediately cable to Cardiff asking for further details of his son's illness. His many friends will earnestly hope that Private Tippet's condition is not as serious as the message might indicate and that his recovery will be speedy.

Among the local men who left St. John in the ranks of the 12th Battalion in the first contingent, few were more widely known than Samuel Charles Tippet, popularly known as "Bud." He was especially prominent in sporting circles and ranked as one of the leading amateur ball players. While at St. Joseph's college, Memramcook, he was the star pitcher on the college nine and afterwards figured in several of the local teams. After leaving college he spent four years in Seattle and returned less than two years ago.

Only last week extracts from one of his letters were published in the local papers telling of his good health and safety thus far. The letter was written on Easter Sunday just after he had come out of the trenches where he had been with his battalion for a stretch of twenty-two hours.

While the cablegram gives no indication of the nature of his illness it is possible that it is one of those who are suffering from acute bronchitis as the result of breathing the fumes of the asphyxiating gases used by the Germans in the big battle of Langemarck. As the hospital mentioned is a new one for Cardiff, it is supposed that it is special military hospital which has been opened since the outbreak of war.

HAMPTON MAN WOUNDED

A telegram reached Mrs. James Adams, of Hampton, yesterday morning announcing that her son, Company Sergeant Major Arthur Adams, of the 13th Battalion, had been wounded at the front. It was stated that information regarding his injury would follow.

Sergeant-Major Adams was well known here. His father, James Adams is navigating officer on the cable ship, Milton, at Halifax, and the wounded man has a sister, Miss Elizabeth Adams, a school teacher in this city. There is one brother, James, at Hampton and another sister, Marguerite, attending Normal School in Fredericton.

At the outbreak of the war, Sergeant-Major Adams, who is about twenty-eight years of age, was attending the military school at Fredericton. He had been there previously, but when he completed his course, he was removed to Halifax as instructor and later he was sent back to the capital as instructor. He volunteered at Fredericton and went from Valcartier with the first contingent.

Two Moncton men, Private Michael Leahy and Private G. A. Steeves are among the wounded.

Ottawa, May 2—Nearly four hundred members of the Canadian contingent are included in casualty lists issued from the militia department in the past thirty-six hours, and the names continue to come to the Record Office here. Private advices from London state that the losses among the Canadians in the sanguinary fighting at Langemarck and St. Julien will reach nearly six thousand. Of these eight hundred have been killed in action, and the balance is about equally divided between wounded and missing, the greater part being among the infantry. This means that half of the infantry at the front with the first division has been put out of action.
