LOCAL UNIONS.

One of the later developments of the Christian Endeavor idea has been in the line of Local Union. These unions are composed of six, eight, or a dozen or more societies, banded together in this way for mutual helpfulness. They have been found very useful, and have stimulated the growth and increased the value of individual societies. The young people who form these unions meet once in two or three months for a discussion of methods of work, or the fundamental principles of the Society, or for meetings of prayer and consecration These meetings have been found of special value in promoting the spirit of brotherhood and Christian fellowship. The organization of these "Unions" should be very simple, and the constitution may be brief as is shown by the following
