

Province of Quebec from the meeting of the First Parliament after the Union in 1867, until its dissolution, 1870; re-elected to that office for the New Parliament, Nov., 1871. Was Mayor of the Town of Levis for six years. Sat for present seat in Can. Assembly, from g. e., 1861, until the Union, when returned by acclamation to House of Commons. Represents Levis in Local House. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same constituency at g. e., 1861. Is Presdt. of Board of Trustees of the Canadian Literary Institute, Woodstock. Was an unsuccessful candidate for South Oxford, in Can. Assembly, at g. e., 1857, and in March, 1863.
