

That the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that it be further amended by leaving out the word "payable," in page 2, line 40, and substituting therefor the word "earned."

The question of concurrence being put on the amendment, the same was agreed to.

The question of concurrence being then put on the main motion, as amended, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and

The said Bill, as amended, was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill (M) intituled: "An Act respecting the inspection of Steamboats and the examination and licensing of Engineers employed on them."

First and second schedules read and agreed to.

Title again read and agreed to.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honourable Mr. Vidal, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same with several amendments, which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive them.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and

The said amendments were then read by the Clerk.

The said amendments being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put on each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honourable Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seconded by the Honourable Mr. Ferguson (P.E.I.), it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time on Monday next.

The Order of the Day being read for the second reading of the Bill (O) intituled: "An Act further to amend the Fisheries Act;"

Ordered, That the same be postponed until Wednesday next.
