

## PRESENT TENSE.

## SINGULAR.

A-mal-ki, I dance  
 A-mal-kan, thou dancest.  
 A-mal-kat, he dances.

## PLURAL.

A-mal-kal-teque, we dance.  
 A-mal-kal-de-yogh, ye or you dancee.  
 A-mal-kal-de-jic, they dance.

## IMPERFECT TENSE.

## SINGULAR.

A-mal-ki-yap, I danced or did dance.  
 A-mal-kape, thou didst, &c.  
 A-mal-kap, he danced, &c.

## PLURAL.

A-mal-kal-de-cup, we dance.  
 A-mal-kal-de-a-hop, ye or you danced, &c.  
 A-mal-kal-dib-nic, they danced, &c.

THE following similarity in the *Pronouns* tend to prove that these languages have the same origin.
