Sir.

I have to report owing too the heavy thunderstorms with hail and rains on 24th, 25th, and 26th, both the river Elbow and Fish Creek rose to an height not experienced for several years doing considerable damage, as follows:-Approaches to Elbow river Weasel Head bridge washed out, a large portion of the flat near thereto undermined and washed away, one small bridge and culvert on Priddis trail undermined, laborer's house at Cow camp washed away, all the bottoms on Fish Creek submerged on both sides of the Creek. This creek rose about lo feet, now subsiding, but has made terrible havoc along its track. The grain fields have escaped wonderfully, very little damage by hail, which is somewhat remarkable considering the force of the storm.
