as to prevent the land being worm out with a repetition of the same crop year after year. They should also be in structed as to building fences, manwing their lands, sowing their grain, root-crops and garden seeds properly, so as to reap the greatest possible benefit therefrom. They should be instructed relative to the proper way of saving their crops and howarng thesame, threshing their gram and converting it into flow and the rates they, should pay for having their flow ground , also , if they, have any eurplus grain, what
