Ottawa, 19th February, 1912.

Sir,

On the 10th January Mr G.H. Race, Agency Clerk, Edmonton, was informed that the Department learned that he had over-drawn his beef ration by 214 pounds. He was told that such a condition of affairs will not be allowed to exist, and that the Department had written Mr Verrean and instructed him to make his deductions from Mr Race's beef rations in installments each month until the over-draft is made good. I enclose for your information copy of Mr Race's reply which is dated the 17th February.

The Department also found it necessary to draw Mr Race's attention to the report that the stock records at the Edmonton Agency are not properly kept. A copy of the letter to him in the matter is transmitted herewith, also copy of his reply which is dated the 1st instant (File No 158020/10).

The Department desires that you will look into this matter, and also that you will get Mr Verrean to reply to the charges which Mr Race has made.
