Wartime Merchant Shipping Limited is supervising the construction of these ships.

A program has been arranged forward to the end of 1943 to enable the shipbuilders to make long range plans and to establish the proper perspective.

Efforts were directed to arranging for deliveries of the above and other ships to the United States Government under the Hyde Park Declaration, and these efforts have now met with success, to the value of over \$150,000,000 by the end of 1942.

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
