- A. I only saw the open door.
- Q. You didn't watch him until he went into the kitchen?
- A. What do you mean?
- Q. Was it up to you to watch where he was going?
- A. Yes, whether drunk or sober.
- Q. At that time was he sufficiently under the meather that you thought he should go to bed?
- A. I didn't think,
