

- Q. And you don't cultivate any land there?
- A. No.
- Q. Have you any horses there?
- A. No.
- Q. Is there any grass land there?
- A. No.
- Q. So that it is really important only as a fishing station?
- A. That is right.
- Q. Now, you have another small reserve called Hinsta's Meadow around the same Hinsta's Lake?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do any Indians live there?
- A. No.
- Q. Do they ever go there for any purpose?
- A. No.
- Q. You don't use it at all?
- A. No.
- Q. Is that a grass country around that lake?
- A. Wild muskeg grows there.
- Q. Do the Indians cut it?
- A. No.
- Q. Is it very good hay?
- A. No, it is very poor.
- Q. Now, where do the rest of your people live - we have a map here and perhaps you could show us at what points the other people live?
- A. We live right here in Telegraph Creek.
- Q. And the land you live on here - you bought yourselves?
- A. Yes, we bought it from the Government.
- Q. Who holds the title for that land?
- A. Each individual owns his own lot.
- Q. How many people here own their own lots?
- A. All Dry-town belongs to the Indians.
- Q. But how many Indians own their own places?
- A. Eleven families.
- Q. And I understand there are some living west of Telegraph Creek -
