Edward Jim is chief of the Tsekum band of Saanich Indians and was arrested for having venison in his pessession out of season. He was proved guilty and fined by Police Magistrate Jay. The case was appealed to the Supreme Court with the result of the decision enclosed being rendered.

According to the ruling of the Chief Justice at Indian in British Columbia is entitled to shoot game at. Indian reserves, any or all times.
