

VANCOUVER.

The City of Vancouver was incorporated in 1886, and was burnt in June, same year.

In 1886, population was 1,000 ;

In 1900, " is 30,000 to 35,000.

In 1899, the amount of Capital invested in buildings in Vancouver, estimated on the most reliable authority, was \$1,500,000, and according to the Board of Trade Report for that year, at least \$500,000 in course of construction, etc.

Vancouver is the terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway and the palatial Steamships of that Company sailing to China and Japan and Australia make Vancouver their headquarters.

Vancouver is the headquarters for the Union S. S. Co. of B. C., and their steamers sail regularly for Juneau, Dyea and Skagway, Alaska, and all way ports.

Daily Boats to Victoria and Nanaimo by the C. P. N. and E. & N. Ry. Co.'s steamers, and tri-weekly to and from Seattle and every five days to and from San Francisco by the Pacific Coast S. S. Co.'s boats.
