VANCOUVER.

The City of Vancouver was incorporated in 1886, and was burnt in June, same year.

In 1886, population was 1,000; In 1900, ' is 30,000 to 35,000.

- In 1899, the amount of Capital invested in buildings in Vancouver, estimated on the most reliable authority, was \$1,500,000, and according to the Board of Trade Report for that year, at least \$500,000 in course of construction, etc.
- Vancouver is the terminus of the Canadian Pacific Railway and the palatial Steamships of that Company sailing to China and Japan and Australia make Vancouver their headquarters.
- Vancouver is the headquarters for the Union S. S. Co. of B. C., and their steamers sail regularly for Juneau, Dyea and Skagway, Alaska, and all way ports.
- Daily Boats to Victoria and Nanaimo by the C. P. N. and E. & N. Ry. Co.'s steamers, and tri-weekly to and from Seattle and every five days to and from San Francisco by the Pacific Coast S. S. Co.'s boats.
