

Ukrainian Printed Characters.	English Equivalents.	Name and Phonetic Pronunciation.
Е, е.	ye.	(yeh) like ye in yet, as еретик (yerel'rik) a heretic.
Ж, ж.	zh, sh.	(zheh) like the French j in jour ; it will be represented by zh , and pronounced as the s in measure (meazhne); before hard consonants and at the end of words it sounds like sh , as муж (moosh) linsband.
З, з.	z, s.	(zeh) pronounced like z , as зівтра (zahv'tra) to-morrow; at the end of words and before hard consonants it sounds as s , as слиз (slis) slime before the soft vowels and the soft sign it is pronounced and denoted by z .
И, и.	i.	y. (i) like i in pin, as кит (kit) the whale, (ee short) occurs as second half of diphthongs. It should be pronounced rapidly with the vowel that precedes it, and resembles the letter y in boy, may, say etc. To represent the sound of this letter i will be used, as дай (dai) give.
И, ї.	i.	(ee) like ee in meet, as кіт (keet) Cat.
Ї, ї.	yee.	(yee) like ye in ye , as їда (yeedah') food.
К, к.	k.	(kah) like k in the word key , as кат (kahit) hangman.
Л, л.	l.	(el) very hard, as l in halt . Soft denoted, as l in leer if followed by a soft vowel or soft sign.
М, м.	m.	(em) as the English m .
Н, н.	n.	(en) like the English n , but pronounced with tip of tongue against teeth. Before the soft vowels and soft sign it is pronounced soft and denoted by н .
О, о.	o.	(oh) like o in or .
