Distant from East Farnham $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles; from Cowansville, $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles; from Granby, 9 miles; from Waterloo, 16 miles; from Knowlton, 16 miles; from West Sheffield, 7 miles; from West Farnham, 11 miles.
