

COUNTY OF COMPTON.

Territorially, Compton is one of the largest counties in the Townships, being only surpassed in size by Beauce. It is 1380 square miles or 761,621 acres in extent, and had a population at the last census of 19,581. It is divided into townships as follows: Compton, Eaton, Westbury, Bury, Hampden, Lingwick, Winslow, Whitton, Marston, Newport, Chesham, Chinton, Emberton, Clifton, Ditton, and Hereford. It lies to the east of Stanstead, Sherbrooke and Wolfe. Compton is rich in mineral resources and lumber; some parts of it are also famous for their agricultural wealth and productions of fine stock. The International (now forming part of the C. P. R. "short line") runs through the county from west to east. Compton has for a quarter of a century been represented in Parliament by the Hon. J. H. Pope, Minister of Railways and Canals.
