Synopsis of Canadian North-West. HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, ex-cepting and 36, not reserved, nay be suid 36, not reserved, nay be suid 36, not reserved, family, or any male oread of a family, or any male oread of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominon Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may, however, be made at any Agency on certain condi-tions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES. - (1) At least six months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homestender may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by giving on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eichty (80) acress in extent, in the vickuity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-shir in land will not meet this re-quirement. quirement

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in by a hollesceader mending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farm-ing land owned by himself must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
