An engrossed Bill, for the establishment of Schools, in the Country Parishes of this Province, and for the teaching of the first rudiments of Education; was read for the third time.

Mr. Taschereau moved, seconded by Mr. Bernier, that the engrossed proviso, marked A. now offered, for fixing the sees of the Prothonotaries of the Courts of King's Bench, for proceedings, had in the said Courts, pursuant to this Bill, do make part of the Bill, and sollow the ninth clause thereof.

And the faid engroffed Proviso being read three times, and the question being put thereon, it was agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That the faid engroffed Proviso do make part of the Bill, and follow the ninth clause thereof.

Mr. Taschereau moved, seconded by Mr. Huot, that the Bill do pass, and that the title be, "An Act for the more effectual establishment of Schools, for the teaching of the first rudiments of Education, in the Country parts of this Province."
