GLADSTONE'S VIEW OF

The following from Premier den's great speech on the navy is worth repeating: "When Mr. Gladstone, then Lib Premier of Great Britain, introduced a closure bill in the House of Commons in 1882, he said in part:—

"It is not a very easy matter to define obstruction, and I will attempt to define it for any one myself. I will only give my own description of it. To me it appears to be the disposition either of a minority of the House or of individuals to resist the prevailing will of the House otherwise than by amendment."
