Edison's 70th Birthday

New York, Feb. 10.—Thomas A. Edison, whose marvelous inventions have smoother the road of life for millions of his fellow-beings and at the same time won for him a conspicuous niche in the hall of fame, will reach his seventieth milestone tomorrow, and great preparations are afoot for a suitable celebration of the occasion. Already the great inventor is being flooded with messages of greetings from every nook and corner of the United States and from foreign countries as well. Mr. Edison has given a solemn promise to stay away from his laboratory and workshop on his birthday and to pass the anniversary in company with relatives and intimate friends who have gathered at his home for the occasion. In the evening over 1,500 or more employees of the Edison plant at West Orange are to join in a banquet and entertainment in honor of their chief.

British Coin in Hiding
London.—From data collected in different parts of the country, the London Evening Star estimates that there are 20,000,000 pounds (\$100,000,000) in gold secreted in Great Britain.

When the war broke out, many individuals dived for gold from the banks, and while much of this has been retrieved, says the newspaper, it is believed the amount mentioned in gold coin still hoarded in stockings or other receptacles in homes or carried in boxes or bags. A considerable sum in gold, according to one authority, is to be found among Scottish crofters and Irish peasant farmers, who since the war began have been making more money than ever before.

Since the campaign for the new war loan began a number of people have appeared at the banks with bags containing from 70 pounds to 800 pounds in gold coins. The number of sovereigns retained by the well-to-do since these coins virtually went out of circulation, it is deemed, would also make a large total.



China Severs Relations With Germany

New York, Feb. 12.—A News Agency despatch from London published here this afternoon says:

"China has broken off diplomatic relations with Germany. It was authoritatively reported here this afternoon."

The Saxonian's Crew

London, Feb. 12.—Nineteen members of the crew of the British tank steamer Saxonian, which was sunk February 8 by a German submarine, were rescued, according to a Central News report. Eight men were injured.

A crew is at present at work on the steamship Yarmouth at St. John's, making necessary repairs before she leaves for the port of New York. The steamer will, in all probability, be ready to sail to-morrow. On arrival at New York the Yarmouth will be placed in dry dock, where she will undergo extensive repairs. She will then be placed in the service between New York and West Indies. It is understood that three other ships of similar type have been purchased by the company for the route between New York and the West Indies. These will be used as auxiliaries to the ships plying between New York and the British Isles. The purchasers are well pleased with the steamer and believe that she will prove very valuable on the West Indies route out of New York.

Belgian Relief Steamer Sunk

London, Feb. 5.—The Belgian relief steamer Lars Kruse, of 1,460 tons and under Danish register, was sunk by a torpedo or mine near the Belgian coast today. The vessel carried a cargo of wheat from Buenos Aires.

The steamer Hurstwood, 1,229 tons, was torpedoed without warning at noon today. Three men were killed by the explosion and three seriously injured, two of whom died after the crew was landed.

Paris, Feb. 8.—The French navy league has opened a subscription list to establish a fund for reward of vessels capturing submarines. The navy league has contributed 10,000 francs.
