MAROUT JUSTICES OF THE PEACE

The Windsor Record having statand that "Dr. Anderson, the defeated Conservative candidate in South Essex, has appointed 105 squires," the ADr. makes the following reply:-"In sthe first place I have no power to aprecint Justices of the Peace and, secandly, the number appointed was not 7005 but 67. Of this number 45 are new appointments and 22 are form-Justices of the Peace re-appointand. This is in striking contrast to want apponents, who rarely, if ever, appointed a Conservative to any of-The Liberals had a total of 91 on the list, and the number has been reduced, as stated, to 67.

It was the same in East Kent. To expecint any new men, and at the same time keep from increasing the mamber, let alone reducing it, a reform favored by many, all of the old T. P.'s could not be re-appointed. As it was re-appointment was offered mearly one-half the old ones, only seventeen offering to serve. The reappointments and the new ones had to be, and were, at least fairly distributed over the various municigalities. As for the contrast, during the entire thirty-three years of Libegal rule not a half-dozen Conservatives were made J. P.'s in East Kent. -Ridgetown Dominion.

DUAL GOVERNMENTS.

Norway and Sweden have settled their differences without coming to Nows, like sensible neighbors who re-Tuse to quarrel over a line fence. A war between these countries would maxe been fratricidal, and would have wurned hereditary friendship into Easting and mutually destructive eanmity. The treaty to which Swedish and Norwegian delegates have assentafter much friction, establishes a meutral zone between the two countries from which fortifications will be razed, excepting a few which have an historic interest. These latter will not be put to military use. Laplanders will have the right of pasturing their reindeer in Norway and there are guarantees that transportation between Norway and Sweden, aspecially the movement of goods in transit, will be facilitated. The agreement is subject to ratification by the Swedish and Norwegian par-Miaments, but the temper of both peoples is pacific and no obstruction is Meared.

The dissolution of the bond beween Norway and Sweden and the securring conditions of deadlock between Austria and Hungary, are urged as a warning against dual par-Caments by English Unionists, and in some quarters as an argument for imperial federation. Against these might be set that of the Russian empire, where a policy of unification, enforced by all the might of Russia, has failed to suppress the national instincts of the Finns, the Poles and the other conquered races, The German empire has been welded together, but it is not a mixture of The Norwegians and the Swedes have a separate ancestry, history and language, and the Maggars of Hungary are ethnically diszinct from the mass of Austrians. In the self-governing portions of the British empire, the bulk of the pcoale are of one race and language, with a common history and tradition. These constitute a fond of mentiment stronger than any process of unification which might interfere with the freedom of action enjoyed by each of the groups into which the empire is divided by geography. If the British empire, like the German, were a geographical unit, the problem would be a simple one. In Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa, every move in the direction of greater self-government is not a step away from true imperial unity, as some would Eave us believe. The history of the mpire teaches differently.


