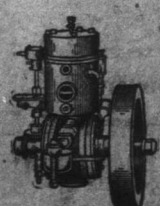

Every day when I go to town, I pass a tiny house between which and the street, is a plot of ground about eight by ten feet—maybe less.

In that plot they have blossomed during the past season crocuses, lilies of the valley, nasturtiums, pansies, poppies, golden glow and baby sunflower. Two feet of earth where the sun comes so seldom that nothing else would flourish, produce the penetrating sweetness of heliotrope.

On either side of the tiny house are large houses, set somewhat back from the street and having respectably large garden plots.

In neither of these plots is there anything like the variety or the profusion of flowers that makes that little eight-by-ten—or maybe less—plot of ground a source of pleasure, not only to its owner, but to every casual beholder.

I suppose you just know about what I'm going to say next.

However, I'm going to say it just the same.

The two middle-sized houses with their carefully cultivated areas of garden opportunity, and the tiny house with its charming little garden, wrested from an eight-by-ten—maybe less—patch of ground that most people wouldn't have thought worth planting at all, are a parable of people to me.

Household Notes.

Mud stains can be sponged from white cloth, when it is inconvenient to wash the whole suit, by using a little ammonia and soapy water.

Do not wash colored clothes in the same water with white ones. This especially holds good if one happens to have table linen with colored borders.

When a teapot has become musty fill it with boiling water and add some strong washing soda. Let it stand for a day, and then scald it thoroughly.

To keep berries and small vegetables in the refrigerator without having them scent the butter and milk put them in small glass jars, and put on the tops.

If buttonholes of starched collars and cuffs are moistened on the inside before buttoning they will button easily, and will be much less likely to tear.

To remove rust from steel, make a paste of fine emery powder and kerosene; rub on, let stand a little while; then polish vigorously with a rag dipped in water.

To make dainty pastry cups, mix a pint of boiled rice with two eggs, line patty pans with it and bake until slightly brown. Fill them with creamed peas, asparagus or meat.

If a pad of felt, cotton or paper be put under the stair carpet at the edge of each step it will save the wear of the carpet, improve its appearance and destroy all insect life.

Red currants mashed to a pulp and then sprinkled with layers of sugar until they are very sweet, make an excellent conserve to serve with beef or whenever currant jelly is appropriate.

There is no greater menace to health than a dirty refrigerator. It should

be thoroughly washed out each week with ammonia water, and a piece of charcoal should always be kept in it.

Both lingerie blouses and shirt-waists stay clean much longer if they have a little stiffening—not hard starched cuffs, but just enough to give a slight body and prevent limpness.

A simple means to purify the atmosphere of a sick room is to burn a string. Take a soft string, pin it to the back of a chair, light the lower end and then blow it out and let it smoulder awhile.

Cold halibut makes an excellent fish salad. It should be cut into pieces large enough for individual plates and served with chopped tomatoes and green peppers. A dressing of mayonnaise is added.

In order to have toast thin and crisp cut the slices from a loaf at least a day old. Dry in an oven before toasting and you will have a much more appetizing morsel than if made in the old way.

A teapot should never be put away with the lid closed, as dampness will gather in it and make it musty. A small stick placed under one side of the lid will admit enough air to keep it dry and sweet.

Silk stockings should be soaked for half an hour in warm suds, softened with ammonia, gently squeezed and rinsed between the hands, blued with ultramarine blue, and dried without using an iron.

If the housewife who takes away sets of napkins to be hemmed on vacation will first run them through the sewing machine hemmer, with unthreaded needle, she will have them evenly marked for hem turning.

Some practical housekeepers get

glass covers for their dressers and writing tables, and put their laces and embroidery mats under the glass, where they show to advantage and are in no danger of being soiled.

The best and simplest fly-killer is a weak solution of formaldehyde in water (two teaspoonfuls to the pint), placed in plates or saucers throughout the house. This is not offensive, and is practically non-poisonous except to insects.

Tan stockings should never be put into bluing water, as it will give them a greenish tinge. Instead, add a little henna powder to the water. The stockings should be soaked in salt water before they are washed the first time.

If there is a shortage of eggs when an omelet is wanted, use a cupful of bread crumbs to every four eggs and the same quantity of milk. It may be sprinkled with a couple of teaspoonfuls of grated cheese just before taking it from the pan.

Visits Grave to Keep Vow of 1854

Mysterious Woman Survivor of the Wreck of the New Era Makes Annual Pilgrimage.

New York, Sept. 20.—In fulfillment of a vow made fifty-six years ago, a woman, veiled in black, visited at West Branch, N. J., the graves in which lie the dead recovered from the wreck of the New Era, off Deal Beach. She placed flowers on the graves, then knelt for a few moments in silent prayer.

On the third Sunday in September every year since 1854, except last year the woman has gone to the cemetery, placed flowers on the graves and prayed. When she was asked last Sunday if she cared to tell the reason for her annual pilgrimage she said:

"I have no objection to telling why I go to the cemetery, but I would prefer not to tell my name. I was one of the survivors of the New Era when that steamship was wrecked, November 13, 1854. I was taken from the rigging with a few others, but several hundred persons were drowned.

"I made a vow that so long as God preserved my health I would go each year to the last resting place of those who died in the wreck. Last year was the only year I have missed, and I would have gone then had I not been ill. I am now seventy years old."

Those persons who saw her Sunday said she looked as if she were in better health than she had been for several years.

Father Returns Home.

And Finds His Wife and Three Children Murdered.

Westchester, Pa., September 21.—Search is being made to-day by the police for a man who is suspected of murdering Mrs. John Saus, her two small daughters and a young son at their home at Byers, Pa., 12 miles from here. The suspected murderers boarded at the Saus home and it is believed robbery was the motive for the terrible deed, and that the four victims were killed in order to prevent identification. The skulls of the woman and her children had been crushed as though by an axe or heavy club.

The bodies were discovered by the husband and father upon his return from work last night. He found his son Charles, aged 7 years, unconscious in the yard. He almost collapsed when he found the bodies of his wife, 30 years old, and his daughters, aged four years and sixteen months respectively.

It is believed Mrs. Saus and her daughters were struck down and the house then ransacked. The boy was at school. It is thought, while this was being done, and he encountered the murderer when he returned home. It is believed the boy recognized the intruder and was killed to prevent him from giving an alarm. The boy was taken to a hospital, where he later died.

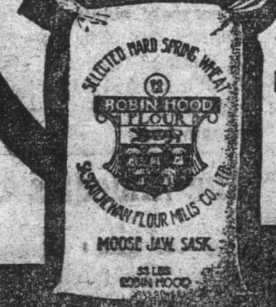
