Military Service Act, 1918.

The following ruling made by The Military Service Board has been ordered to be published:

NOTICE TO REJECTED VOLUNTEERS.

That men who have volunteered and have been rejected for military service on or before May 11th, 1918, and who have reported for service as required by the Act on forms prescribed, will not be called for medical re-examination before the 31st of October, 1918. Number of Rejection Badge or date of Rejection Certificate should be given on the printed Report sent in to the Registrar.

Any person wishing to claim exemption in respect of a Rejected Volunteer coming within Class 1 must do so within the time appointed by the Proclamation of the 11th of May, 1918, or such further time as may be allowed by the Exemption Tribunal.


