APPEAL TO THE PUBLIC

Amongst those who were present were His Lordship Bishop White, Mayor Morris, Rev. Mr. Rev. C. H. Johnson, Mr. Higgins, K.C., M.H.A., Col. and Mrs. S. A. Martin, Mrs. E. G. Hunter, Ladies of the Association, Mr. B. Ayre and Civic Commissioner. In a brief speech His Excellency explained the purpose of the Home, and congratulated the committee in charge of the Home on the work already accomplished.
