WOODSTOCK BUYS FARM AND VALUABLE SPRINGS

Water Commissioners Purchase Land on Which Is City's Water Supply. [Special to The Advertiser.]

Woodstock, Feb. 21.—The water commissioners of this city have concluded sors of the Thornton farm, adjoining the property on which is the city ant purchase, as it not only insures the preservation of 6 or 7 acres of large timber, which acts as a shade for the present supply, but it also adds four valuable springs, with which to augment the water supply whenever and the purchase price was \$8,200. The springs are so placed that they have a natural fall to the city's reservoir, and no expense will be incurred in bringing it there. The commissioners have been saving up for the past few years, and have now a balance almost sufficient to pay for the farm. present intention is to resell all the farm except about 8 acres, which include the woods and springs, there is a strong feeling in the city that it would be better to retain the whole farm as a forest reservation, which would be of great value in the


