Outruns an Angry Honduran Gener Armed With Pistol and Escapes to Salvador.

Puerta Cortez, Honduras, April 20, via New Orleans.—News reached here today from Tegucigalpa of a hotfoot race between Policarpo Bonilia, formerly president, and General Antonio Frarres, with the life of Policarpo Bonilia as the stakes. Senor Bonilia won by a scratch and escaped to Salvador with his life.

During the recent revolution Policarpo Bonilia lined up with the faction opposing Manuel Bonilia, and in the peace negotiations attempted to get the presidency as a compromise candidate. General Frarres commanded a division of Manuel Bonilia's army, Policarpo Bonilia publicly denounced General Frarres in Tegucigalpa. General Frarres in Tegucigalpa.
