## WORLD NEWS CUT SHORT

**TOKIO, May 8.**—The Japanese cabinet crisis, which arose early in the week, when Premier Takahashi was reported to have requested the resignation of his cabinet in order to form a new government in sympathy with his views, has been temporarily averted.

The premier announced at yesterday's meeting of the cabinet that he would not persist in this request, as there was other business requiring the cabinet's immediate attention.

**PARIS, May 8.**—The Belgian government, eliminating official red tape, has ordered the laying of the "Loth cable" for guiding airplanes.

The first cable, the construction of which already has commenced, will be 10 kilometers in length and extend from the commercial airdrome of Evere to Brussels.

It is being affixed for the present to telegraph poles, but eventually will be placed underground. The line will be completed in ten days, after which it will be officially tested by Jules Patin, dean of Belgian commercial pilots.

**MANILA, P. I., May 8.**—The Prince of Wales, who will arrive here on May 13, will be accorded highest military honors, including a 21-gun salute and similar ceremonies of welcome usually reserved for a president of the United States, according to the military program made public here.

The only change will be that "God Save the King" will be played by the band instead of "The Star Spangled Banner."

**PARIS, May 8.**—The seriousness of the housing shortage is indicated by the anonymous letter campaign, which has broken out in St. Etienne. The letters are not inspired by malice or revenge, but by the desire of a group of persons to obtain homes.

The first letter addressed to a householder contains a threat of death if he does not vacate his apartment, and this is followed by threats to ruin his reputation and force him to move if he will not do so voluntarily.

As part of the campaign, notices appear in the local papers falsely stating that tenants have moved from town, thus causing them no end of annoyance.

**LONDON, May 8.**—In compliance with the terms of the naval treaty signed at the Washington armament conference, the British dreadnought Erin was put out of commission at Sheerness today and ordered sold.

The Erin was one of a score or more of battleships added to the British navy during the war. Laid down in 1911, she was launched in 1913, and completed in August, 1914.

Just after the war broke out, her normal displacement was 23,000 tons. Her armament consists of ten 13.5-inch 45 calibre guns and six 6-inch guns, with anti-aircraft guns and torpedo tubes. She had a designed speed of twenty-one knots. Her complement was 1,130 men.

The High Almoner and his assistants were dressed in white instead of the usual towels, which their predecessors used in Queen Elizabeth's time, when they washed the feet of a number of old persons on Maundy Thursday.

## WOMAN DIES FROM DRINKING ALCOHOL

**Authorities Say Not Suicide, But Merely Victim of Intemperate Habits.**

**BOTTLE MARKED POISON**

**Light Commission Accepts Offer From Council of Spas in New City Hall.**

**KITCHENER, May 8.**—As a result of taking too much wood alcohol a woman of this city who was employed by a dentist to clean out his office, is dead. The woman, it is believed, had been addicted to alcohol, and while cleaning out the office of the dentist after hours found some wood alcohol in the dentist's laboratory. Although it was distinctly marked poison, she took it for kerosene. It is not intimated by the authorities that the woman committed suicide, but was merely a victim of intemperate habits. No inquest will be held.

**LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 8.**—Guarded by private detectives and attendants who travelled in a special palace car with him, Morvich, favorite of the Kentucky Derby, to be run at Churchill Downs here next Saturday, arrived at the racetrack late yesterday from New York.

According to the attendants, the colt made the trip in fine shape. He is being given his initial workout at the racetrack today. Food and water in sufficient quantities to last Morvich until after the race were brought along in the same train with Morvich came My Playful, brother of Edward E. Simms, also had a good trip. Other horses, including the Derby horse, are expected to arrive at the track today.
