

OTTAWA OFFICIAL ARRESTED

ACTING COMMISSIONER OF CUSTOMS CHARGED WITH MALFEASANCE. Watters Placed Under Arrest By Order of the Department of Justice for Not Accounting for Public Money Com-mitted to His Charge-Three Cheques of

\$90 the Specific Charge. Ottawa, Jan. 80 .- The greatest sensa tion which Ottawa has experienced for many a long day was felt this evenhomas J. Watters, Acting Commissioner of Customs, had been arrested about 5 o'clock by Inspector O'Leary of the Dominion Police on a charge of not accounting for public money committed to his charge. The announcement was re-ceived with incredulity, and although there is no doubt as to the fact. Mr. Watters' friends and they are numerous, decline to believe that he has guilty of any wrong-doing, and feel confident that he will be easily able to show that there has not been any misconduct on his part. 
