FOURTEEN KILLED IN AN AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT

Truck Carrying Masqueraders Struck By Train—Thirteen Others Injured

WOODBURY, November 2—Fourteen persons were killed and thirteen injured some of them seriously in the grade crossing accident at Lakesboro, eight miles from here, late last night, when a Pennsylvania railroad train struck an automobile truck of masqueraders. Twelve of the victims were killed instantly and two others died at the Cooper hospital, Camden. Two of them were women. Ten of the injured are still in the hospital and it is feared some of them cannot recover. All of the dead and injured were from the Kensington mill district of Philadelphia. There were thirty two persons in the truck. They were returning home from after attending a Halloween party at Billingsport. The accident occurred in a driving rain; and it is believed the driver failed to see the approaching train until it was too late to stop.
