

in regard to the list of Birds noticed in
the Winter Season, in the vicinity of Allon-
-treach, by Mr. D. W. B. B. and refer-
red to by Mr. S. C. McNamee, and published
ed in volume 2 of 'the Canadian
Naturalist', the first of the following:
Hairy Wood, Smoky Owl, Barred Owl,
Brown Creeper, Chickadee, Robin, Pine
Siskin, Junco, Redpoll, Pine Linnet,
Pine Grosbeak, Crow, Blue Jay, Northern
Shrike, Northern Flicker, White Breasted
Nuthatch, Hairy Wood, Wren, and King-
-let. - 12 species; and he also
mentions the report that a Goshawk, a Gold
Finch, and a Wren, had been seen.
In this article Mr. D. W. B. also spe-
-aks of the paper by Mr. Allen on the
Birds wintering at Toronto, and pub-
-lished in the Canadian Journal for
March 1853 (four years before) as re-
-cording 24 species, of which the following
12 species were not observed by him
at Allon-treach, - Bull Eagle, Pigeon Hawk,
Great Horned Owl, Gold Finch, Tree
Sparrow, Red-Crossed, Canada Jay,
Red-bellied Nuthatch, Hairy Wood-
-pecker, Quail and ~~Chipping~~ Sparrow.
- while the Brown Creeper, and the Hairy
Owl are not mentioned by Mr. Allen.
Of Mr. Allen as a writer on Birds
