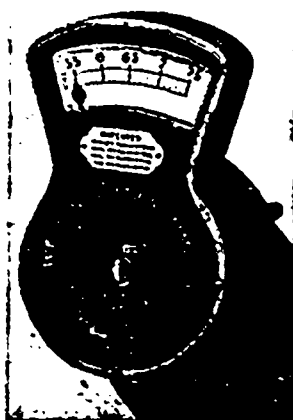

The Weston Arc Light Ammeter is cheap, but, nevertheless, reliable and very accurate.

The scale is so proportioned that a change of 10 of one ampere can be seen from considerable distance. The instrument is absolutely "dead beat." Three different ranges are being made:

- No. 1 5.5 6.8 7.8 amperes in 1-10 amp. div.
- No. 2 8.6 9.6 10.6 " " 1-10 " "
- No. 3 9.5 10.5 11.5 " " 1-10 " "
