- A \$9 million second phase to the Integrated Natural Resources Project in the Guayape Valley will increase agricultural diversification and rural employment. Scheduled to be completed in 1996, it will benefit small agro-industry business development and improve credit services.
- A \$5 million project is bringing potable water to 81 Honduran communities. It will provide basic health education, administration and upkeep of the systems and watershed production.
- Canada is substantially involved in the energy sector through the Power System Master Plan Project (\$5 million) which is helping Honduras to promote efficiency and predictability, private-sector participation, and equity in electrical supplies.
- The new five-year \$16.5 million Honduras-Canada Environment Management Fund (developed through the Debt Conversion initiative) aims to improve environmental and natural resources management by supporting small-scale sustainable development initiatives.
- A \$15 million Development Line of Credit has been used to support more than 20 projects in the fields of education, water systems, housing, women, the environment and small business. This project will end in 1996.
- Through the Canada Fund, Canada also provides support for women's groups, the Human Rights Ombudsman and public housing.
- Planned bilateral programming includes a final \$10.1 million phase for the Guayape Valley; a \$4 million rural water project for the Atlantic coast region to complement the Hardwood Forests Development Project; and a \$5 million Natural Resource Policy Advisory Project.
- The Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) provides partnership program support to multi-country projects with activities in Honduras, including those of the Mennonite Central Committee and Horizons of Friendship.
- Non-governmental institutions are currently receiving CIDA support for
 projects that assist environmental organizations, animal production, and
 the Commissioner for Human Rights. CIDA is also providing support
 to multi-country projects with activities in Honduras dealing with
 education and support to the cooperatives movement.
