money required to keep on building co-operative housing projects. The Prime Minister was unable to answer my question, but he made the commitment to me that he would have the Minister of Public Works, who is the Minister responsible for housing, send me the answer to that question. The Minister of Public Works has still failed to do so.

I can talk about co-operative housing as being a solution to the problem with which we are faced. There are 500,000 people in Canada who are paying more than 30 per cent of their incomes for housing. These are the people who, because so much of their income is committed to housing, would very quickly join a co-operative if they could be sure that instead of the monthly payments of \$400 or so that they had already committed to a project, they would not have to pay \$700 a month next year. Many Hon. Members who have been approached by their constituents during the last few years will know that some of those constituents started out with—
